- Manage and coordinate the production of educational and communication material in support of the CAA's Airspace Infringement Strategy, promoting effective engagement between the CAA and its partners regarding the widespread reduction in Airspace Infringements.
- Provide specialist support to Future Airspace Team members in identifying priority plans, milestones and regulatory enablers for airspace modernization in the UK in particular you will coordinate and contribute to the delivery of the widespread uptake and education of VFR Moving Map technology and help develop any required regulatory oversight.
